YOUR NOVEMBER LIST OF THE DEAD

The month of November is traditionally the month, when we are encouraged by the Church to have Masses said for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The special envelope and printed sheet available for you today you may take home and write down the names of all those people (relatives, friends, parishioners, acquaintances) that you wish to pray for and have the holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered for. You can include as many people as you wish, including non-Catholics.

When you have completed your November List of the Dead, you put this in the special envelope provided and you also include your Mass offering (stipend).

Then you bring your envelope back to church with you before the end of October and place it in the bowl in front of the Altar.

All these November Pious Lists will remain on the Altar throughout the month of November, and **ALL** the holy Masses during November will be offered for the people you have named in your November List of the Dead.

At the end of November, the November Lists of the Dead will remain in the church for the rest of the year and prayers and Masses will said from time to time for all those who are named therein.
