# January 12th St Benet (Benedict) Biscop (628 - 690)

As a young man he was a nobleman at the court of King Oswy of Northumbria. His desire to enter the monastic life took him on two pilgrimages to Rome. After his second visit, he joined the Community at Lerlins, off the coast of France, taking the name Benedict. He stayed there for two years, then made many visits to other monasteries to study their rule. While in Rome in 669. he was asked to return to England with Theodore, the new archbishop of Canterbury, and he remained at Canterbury as abbot for a further two years. He was then helped by King Egfrith to found two monasteries in the north: one at Wearmouth in 674 and the other at Jarrow in 682. Benet continued to visit the continent, especially Rome, and brought back plainsong to his monks. When Benet died, after a protracted illness, his monasteries had already become important centres of learning and Christian culture.
