

OUTREACH HOUSING UPDATE

Outreach Housing, which came out of our Outreach Group, runs a Supported Accommodation house in Bensham for 'new 'refugees, at risk of homelessness. Last month we received our first Inspection from SHIP (Supported Housing Improvement Programme). We are pleased to share that the Inspection Report was very good. We passed all 34 standards, with 16 of these being awarded 'B' Good and 6 'A' Excellent.

MOVING ON: More good news is that one of our residents has been offered a property from Gateshead Council and will be moving soon. We will do all we can to support this young man as he moves on to an independent life and will use the Outreach Housing funds to assist him, e.g. with floor coverings and curtains. We would also welcome additional contributions from anyone who would like to help. JOE'S PLACE

At Joe's Place this week the menu was: scrambled eggs on toast, fish, chips and mushy peas, toasties with a variety of fillings, apple crumble or cake with custard.

We served 30 scrambled eggs, 75 fish, chips and peas, 107 to asties and 74 desserts.

We used 60 eggs, 75 frozen fish fillets, 10kgs of chips and 5 bags of frozen mushy peas, 14 loaves of bread, 3 tins of ham, 3 tins of corned beef, 2 tins of tuna, 3 packets of frozen apples, 6 packets of crumble mix, 4 large cakes and 12 tins /packets of custard as well as salad, milk, butter, oranges and bananas.

We are always grateful for donations, especially of tins of mince and stewed steak, corned beef, ham, potatoes and custard. Cakes and wrapped biscuits are also appreciated.

FOOD CO-OP

Dear Supporters, this week at the Food Co-op 48 families/couples and 48 single people collected food (149 adults and 101 children). Donations were received from several local churches, a primary school, Gateshead Food Bank, a small independent food bank provision with a surplus, a housing scheme with an unexpected surplus and individual supporters. All were gratefully received and distributed during the session. The allocation from Fare Share included raspberries, mushrooms, fresh fruit salad pots and cartons of tomato passata. This ensured that everyone left with a varied selection of tinned, dried and fresh food.

Last week the Food Coop was inspected by the Environmental Health team at Gateshead Council. We received a top rating of 5 - very good. All the volunteers contributed to ensuring the trollies, surfaces and floors had a Spring Clean. We were given advice on maintaining this standard and this is being shared with the volunteers.

Thank you for your continued commitment and for your response to last week's appeal. As you can imagine, the process of keeping the stocks up is like painting the Tyne Bridge! Kind Regards Kath

Saturday Evening Vigil Masses

As I announced about both of the Saturday evening Masses last week, Bishop Stephen has suggested that a longer period of consultation should take place in relation to our Saturday evening Vigil Masses.

I advised that for the month of May, we would continue to have Vigil Masses in both parishes, but that was not sustainable long term, especially at the times we have had. This Saturday will be the last Saturday we have the Mass at 5.15pm at St. Anne's and at 6.15pm at St. Peter's.

In June and July there will be one Vigil Mass only

I know that I originally said these Masses would be the other way around, however St. Anne's First Communion Mass is set to take place on the 8th June. It is only right and just that this goes ahead on the planned date, hence the change.

For June and July the weekday Masses will be as follows:

Monday 10am - St Peter's Tuesday 7pm - Corpus Christi Wednesday 10am - St. Peter's Wednesday 12noon - St. Anne's Thursday 10am - Corpus Christi

Please note that it is hoped that Mass will be offered each day each week as stated. However, this may not always be possible. Your understanding is appreciated.

During June and July, after the 12noon Mass on Wednesdays at St. Anne's I would like to invite all those who come to gather in the hall for tea, coffee and cake afterwards. This is an opportunity for us to gather and relax as a faith community and get to know one another outside of the Mass setting.



As Christians we are called to follow Jesus. To go that extra mile for ohers. To help those who are struggling, to visit those in prison or in hospital. We may not be crucified, but sometimes the things we do, because we know they are right, are like walking across miles of lego; not just one or two bricks. This poster hangs in my upstairs sitting room. It is there as a remind that to show Jesus' love to other might feel like walking across Lego bricks, but if you love someone, then the pain is forgotten in the Love that we share...

"Becoming Who You Are" by James Martin SJ.

This is one of those books that I have read and re-read many times. It is a book that was written to help us look at who we really are; the person that God created us to be, as opposed to the one that we can often portray to the world and those we come into contact with. It is about removing the masks that we create over time and allowing our true selves to shine through. This can and is a very daunting thought for many
