FOOD CO-OP

Dear Supporters,

This week 102 people representing 55 families/couples and 47 single people (150 adults and 99 children) attended the Food Co-op. It was a very steady session with people queuing before 8.30am and arriving until the close at 12.45. Donations were received from several local churches, primary schools and individual supporters. All were most welcome.

On Monday morning we were delighted to have pupils and staff from Year 6 at St Peter's School. The school had been collecting items for the Food Co-op from before Half Term and the group walked down to Corpus Christi. Each child carried a full backpack of donations. They then worked in teams and cleaned all the food trollies and sorted all the items they had donated ready for Tuesday. It was good opportunity for the youngsters to find out more about how the Food Co-op works. Their enthusiasm for cleaning and sorting was a real tonic for all the volunteers on a Monday morning.

Once again, many thanks for all the donations and thanks to those who deliver them to Corpus Christi in good time for Tuesday's session.

JOE'S PLACE

This week the menu was corned beef hash with baked beans, scrambled eggs on toast, toasties with a variety of fillings, cake or bananas with custard. We served 58 corned beef dinners, 30 scrambled eggs on toast, 4 beans on toast, 84 toasties with a variety of fillings, 56 desserts and 104 sandwiches.

We used 60 eggs, 16 tins of corned beef, 18 tins of potatoes, 4 tins of ham, 70 cheese slices, 18 tins of baked beans, 12 loaves of bread, 6 large cakes, 12 packets/ tins of custard as well as milk, butter, salad, bananas and orang-

Saturday Evening Vigil Masses

Just over two weeks ago, I spoke to all of those who are in attendance at the Saturday Vigil Masses I made a proposal that offered a different solution for moving forward in the long term for both the Saturday evening Mass goers at St. Anne's and St. Peter's.

I preposed the following:

St. Anne's - Saturday Vigil at 4pm St. Peter's - Saturday Vigil at 5.45pm

These would take place throughout the year except if I was on holiday. During any weekend holiday time there would be **no Vigil Masses** in the parish as I feel this would be too much to ask a supply priest to cover. During any holiday time there would only be two Sunday Masses, the 9am at Corpus and the 10.30am at St. Peter's.

Weekday Masses, I advised would also cahnge; with only three weekday Masses, one in St. Anne's, one is Corpus Christi and one in St. Peter's.

I asked people at the time to let me know what they thought.

Whilst there hasn't been huge numbers of people banging on the doors of the presbytery, or having to press redial as the presbytery phone line has been constantly engaged, some people have spoken to me.

With this in mind, I have taken to decision to run with the proposed suggestion and for this to begin from this coming weekend.

I hope that you will agree that this is a good solution moving forward.

Have you ever stood on the edge of and wondered what the solution is...

We all have those moments in our lives where we wonder what the answer is... but where do you go or how do you find the time and the space to work through things in order to find the answer.

Prayer is so important in our lives. When I talk about prayer in this context I am not talking about using words or sitting through a Mass. I am talking about opportunities we create in our lives in order to just 'be'. To listen to the silence or the noise of wherever we are and to try to hear the small voice of God whispering our names.

I find building Lego leads me to a place where my mind is freed from everything else... I can often find my time building extremely prayerful; the creativity and the physical handling of the bricks often allows me a space to pray; to thank God for the joys, the upsets, the trials,

the mundane and the extraordinary things that fill our lives.

But, there are two other places that I find just as helpful (sometimes more so) when it comes to prayer; both are water related.

Sitting on a beach watching and listening to the waves of the sea I find so meditative. Trying to focus on the different sounds, can be both soothing and allow us to focus on the minute sounds within sounds that we hear. Just as soothing perhaps even more mesmorising is sitting by the edge of a river waiting for 'slack tide'.

'Slack tide' is that moment, which may not last very long, when the earths pull on the river stops... the water may have been flowing in for high tide, but that has been reached and for a few moments, everything in the river appears to just pause... the surface of the water often becomes like glass as it reflects the sky back onto itself.. For those few moments, everything seems to say... all is well, all is at peace. Then, as quickly as 'slack tide' began, it fades. The water turns in the opposite direction... everything begins to flow again, in that great hurry as the worlds pull on the water takes hold. The water will continue until low tide has been complete and then, once again, the water pauses once more as everything once again seems to pause for a few brief moments... before it all begins again!

What helps you to find moments with God in prayer? Where do you go? If you don't, how can you create them?
