The New Lectionaries

The Lectionary is the books containing the Scripture Readings that we use at Mass. The current translation is being changed and so from the First Sunday of Advent we will be listening to a different translation of the Bible. This means that each parish needs to buy a new set of books for use at Mass. In this new publication there are four volumes to be used throughout the year and a separate Book of the Gospel. As you might guess these books are expensive the four-volume set for use in Church costs £695 and the Book of the Gospels is £275 – there is also the need to buy a small 'study' edition set of four volumes for use when Mass is celebrated in a small room or for Masses outside and this costs £250. There is a further edition that I think would be better suited for St. Anne's and Holy Rosary, the Chapel Edition, which costs £395.

We often hear it said that first impressions say so much and that when we are meeting people for the first time the first impression we give often stays with them; we are also told not to judge a book by its cover, but how many of us do.

When I was in a school, I heard an assembly where they talked about making good endings. The person leading the assembly was telling the students that making a good ending was as important as the first impressions we give; perhaps they are even more important.

Whenever we are finishing something we have been involved with, whether it is after a short period of time or years, I believe it is impotent for ourselves as well as those that we have been involved with, to ensure that when we finish our time we don't leave lose ends, but that most importantly we finish and ensure that it is as positive as it can be.

Saying goodbye may not be enough. Thanking people you have worked with and ensuring that there is a positivity surrounding all those you have come into contact with is something I feel as Christians we are called to do. We will not always get one with people and sometimes our experiences or relationships with people can be difficult or fraught. By ensuring we have a good ending when we move on helps those relationships to have some form of healing.


