

Bishops and Superiors will almost always accept the persons resignation, in the case of a Parish Priest, it usually mean that they change from being a Parish Priest to a Parochial Administrators; the difference is very minor, but it does mean that they could be asked to move at any time. Deacons are slightly different due to their position in the church, however their resignations are also generally always accepted. This allows the deacon, and their wife and family, to be able to spend time en-

This allows the deacon, and their wife and family, to be able to spend time enjoying their well earned retirement; which is right and just. People work extremely hard and when you are a deacon, on top of their role and duties in the parish they work full time.
